People that say that Puerto Rico is like Hawaii are out of their minds! Temperature & humidity are comparable but nothing else is. San Juan has a population of 2 million and it's like L.A. It will be a very interesting year. Major crimes are almost unheard of here but there is lotsa burglaries & car thefts. Consequently 80% of the houses & apts. have bars all over the place. It is partly the spanish influence but partly fear of being ripped off. The bars are all decorative so it looks kinda pretty on the outside but inside ya can't help but to feel like a prisoner of sorts! And everyone who has a car worth keeping removes a vital part of their motor and carties it with them to help ward off theft. It is pretty once ya get out of San Juan. A few people from AMG and Marly & I took a drive around the island. It's very pretty but not quite as pretty as Hawaii. The unemployment rate is 20% so there's lotsa barrios. Another problem is there are lotsa stray animals. Catholicism is so heavy here and it goes against the grain of the people to get their pets neutered. So dumb! It tears my heart to see all these dogs running loose raiding trash cans for a living. Many of them are maimed from colliding with cars. They are mutts and mutts tend to be the cutest dogs 'cause of the strange parent combinations. Catholicism is a very destructive religion - not only does it make people feel obligated to bring more people into the world than they can handle and afford but it makes 'em do it to their pets too and if there's one thing I can't stand it's someone who messes up an animal. My pets are fine. They are shedding quite a bit but they don't seem to be suffering from the weather. James is taking a medicine to prevent heart worms. Cats don't get heart worms. That is a bad condition carried by some mosquitos. It isn't as prevalent as I had feared if was so James'll be okay! Hookworms are another buggy here. I forgot to ask how that is spread but those are curable worms so im not as worried about them as I am about heart worms. There are lotsa lizards here. They're all kinda cute though I don't recognize what kind they are. My cats are fascinated by 'em. They (lizards) like to stick to the screen during the heat of the day and Toto & Spooky just wat 'em. I think if one was in the house that they'd just wat on it or run and hide.

James doesn't mind 'em either which is a relief. If I had to pick up dead lizards every time he went outside he'd have to learn how to use the toilet and have to do push ups for excercise!! We have a pretty nice place - lotsa good hiding spots for Tot & Spook and no rug so James has a cool floor to lay on. Marty is close too so that's good!! Haven't decided yet where I want to work. There are several places that look good and don't require Spanish so will make up my mind when the time comes. My savings can't last forever so will make up my mind pretty quick! There's a nice big yard here for James. There's even a little metal storage shed! People before left sacks of leaves & stuff in it though and I was gonna clean it out yesterday but a little mouse ran when I opened the door. I'm not afraid of mice but I don't want to work around 'em so I'll hire a gardener to get that cleared out and get the yard shaped up then I'll maintain it. Boy dad you should see some of the trees & bushes here. Gorgeous. I've seen some Ti plants that would make your molars grow back! I want to send you guys some cuttings or seeds. Is there anything in particular that you want? Tropical plants are so pretty!! There are three gorgeous bushes outside this house. You have 2 of em here but the third is something I've never seen. Has bright yellow trumpet shaped flowers. I'm gonna name some of my lizards. I guess they're pretty territorial 'cause they always go to the same spot. I'm so glad ya taught me not to be afraid of lizards. This would really be a nightmare if they gave me the creeps. Marty doesn't like 'em. There's lotsa dragon flies and he doesn't like them either. He doesn't like it here but for a year it will be interesting for all of us. I found out why AMC is so willing to do anything. Infomeg was getting all the business. AMC has been running on mediocre people because of mediocre pay. AMC Toletta is gonna be sending all the flying head programs to AMC Caribe because Puerto Rico gives all sorts of things to companies that bring jobs here. Like, ya don't have to pay taxes on anything for 20 years! This (along with other breaks) more than makes up for any taxes that the States may levy on imported goods. AMC Toletta is gonna become almost strictly proto type and Caribe will handle established orders. They will be sending 3330's and Winchesters. These are the programs that I raised from infancy there. They will pay me good money to get them rolling here. I may do it but I would prefer working as a waitress or something in the Condado -

P.R's

which is Hawaii's version of Waikiki. I won't work days and AME has only that shift. Once they start expanding and filling other shifts ill consider but until then ill work with Joe Public. Spanish is nice but not required in the Condado. Thank heavens!! Jim getting brown! Haven't been real stupid by trying to do it in a day plus it rained two days so I may not feel like a banana. The trip here was something, I have James tranquilizers but they wore off by the time we got to Kennedy. We had to transfer him from United to Eastern and he was so happy to see us that parting was not sweet sorrow. I had given him more tranquilizers there but before they took effect he literally chewed his way out of the kennel and got loose where they handle the baggage in the basement. They paged me and I thought id die because I knew something was wrong with my pets. By the time I got to the basement he was leashed but they didn't want to try to put him in the new kennel (free by the way!) They just loved him 'cause he was so sweet. Everyone was so nice and helpful. If I didn't know James I wouldn't want to try to catch him! They teletyped San Juan to let 'em know that a dog may be loose in the cargo. They let us move up to first class upon descent so we could be the first off the plane and before they opened the hold they took Marly out there so James would find who he wanted right away instead of having to roam the runway looking. It turned out that the trans's were still working and he was safe in his kennel. That James nearly gave me a heart attack!! But we're all here and safe and happy so what else is there?? Gotta go now. Its late & I am sleepy. See ya!

I decided to quit sulking when she saw all the commotion and I grabbed her as she started to whizz by. By this time Spooky & James had flushed it out of the corner and it turned out to be a mouse!! Yuck! I couldn't bring myself to escalating a mouse out of the house so I put Toto down and walked outside. The last thing I saw was 4 animals about to collide. I'm sure the mouse escaped due to the non-hunting abilities of my truly domesticated animals. I waited for a neighbor to come home to check the horses for bird & parts before I came in and there was nothing there! I don't know if it's good that the mouse escaped but I know it's good that he wasn't toyed with. This really isn't an animal place. There's just lets ~~a~~ not usual things go on' on. Expect people to hate me every time I move to
a different area. Communication is difficult
but with their little bit of English and my
little bit of Spanish coupled with a lot
of manual communications I get by.

this mess for now and get it off the
mail so you don't think I died in transit.

Hello there and many happy returns! Shame on me for letting so many letters pile up before I respond. I'll answer all the letters before adding new stuff. Puerto Rico's "out-kits" is about 10 Km's from here. Night jobs are definately out of the question except for hookers, pimps, and thieves. Since I don't fall into any of these categories a night job is out. My cats finally caught a mouse. They ate from the waist down and left the waist up as a wake up surprise for me. There is nothing worse than having a head of a mouse and two proud cats to contend with first thing in the morning. Two lizards have gotten in, but I found em in time to let em out while they still had all their limbs. James didn't chew out of his cage in 4 hours. It didn't even take him 15 minutes. We gave him to the porter at 9:30 and before 10:30 I got that scary page. Am seriously considering taking a boat back. Why not since AMC is paying so I don't have to traumatize my pets like that & getting Am also considering your advice to let him dog-paddle to Florida & drive from there!! AMC doesn't pay well at all here. One lady has been here 4 years and she just got a 15% raise that put her at 2.72 per hour. No wonder all American companies send their plants over seas. They have everyone over a barrel here since jobs are hard to find. People don't rebel 'cause a pitance is a pitance. It really bdes my mind. I believe that 50% of the people are still on welfare. When I go shopping about everyone I have seen pay with food stamps. It sort of makes me sick to my stomach to see their carts filled with cornish game hens & pineapple upside down cake mixes. It seems to me that in order to eat well one must be poor. And these same people that pay with food stamps invariably have really nice clothes. Generally speaking Puerto Ricans are very appearance conscious and won't go out of the house unless they look smashing. Puerto Rico truly is precariously balanced on the economic tight rope. Good to hear it only takes 3 days for letters to travel. I don't feel so out of touch with you. Dad's greenhouse sounds like P.R. only here you can't walk out the door for relief. The weather seems more oppressive here than in Hawaii. That's probably because in Hawaii I was on the beach and here I'm not. So nice you people got a power outage!!! I know it makes that chore easier for both of ya! Don't feel guilty about my having used a push mower. Powers kind of scare me so I prefer push. Marlys mom has been in touch with him. She was kind of concerned about her Roseburg property but felt better when she heard Louise Evans healthy was overseeing it. She's gonna go up there (own)

in awhile to visit it. The company phone privileges
 have been sharply curtailed. It used to be anyone
 could call anyone but a couple of big bills later
 there's allowing only plant to plant calls. And
 even then the callee must get permission. There
 is an English newspaper called The San Juan Star
 but not many of them find their way out here to
 Pudrona. Most everything is in Spanish - messages
 from utilities, flyers from Sears, even salesmen
 are Spanish. It is a good way to learn the
 language though so I'm not complaining! My
 household supplies finally arrived - 5 weeks after
 mailing them. They came by boat. It really
 tipped me off because so much of the stuff
 was broken. The crock pot & juicer I sent in
 the original packing. The crock pot was in a
 million pieces, even the metal was dented. The
 juicer was okay except the collection cup was
 cracked. Of 4 plates I were okay, 4 bowls I were
 okay, 3 cups one was okay. Mandy had packed
 the stuff up for me 'cause I didn't know where
 it was so he filled out all the claims. I
 was so mad. All the packages had FRAGILE
 written on 'em and yet as near as I can figure
 they threw it in the hold of the ship and when
 they found a "hole" they'd throw something else
 in. I'm gonna get every penny I paid BACK
 'cause I didn't pay \$50. And wait 5 weeks to
 have them deliver that crap to me. My pans
 made it okay and so did the silverware. These
 are about the only things they couldn't & didn't
 damage. I have found a store with pretty low
 prices. It's called Bargaintown and it looks like
 two bays and has service like Bullock's Emporium.
 It's about as cheap as ya can get here. The only
 awful thing about it is that carts get nipped-off
 so to keep that from happening they have made it
 so ya can't take the cart any further than right
 outside the front of the store. If ya have more
 sacks than ya can handle you have to keep an
 eye on the cart (or try to) to make sure someone
 doesn't run off with what ya couldn't carry. It
 is a nuisance if ya don't have a friend to stand
 guard over your remaining parcels. There's a legless
 man there who sits in his wheel chair every day
 all day begging. His pleasant enough - he just
 says "Beeches Beeches" and if ya give him something
 he thanks you. You could bet money that he will
 be there no matter ~~what~~ what time or day it is. There's
 also 3 regular dogs looking for handouts.

Thanks for the pictures! You sure did a lot of renovating on my cat house. Didn't realize you were gonna fiberglass parts of the walls too! That must have been some project. Glad ya had Mike to help ya. The dogs didn't look good in those pictures but I looked so thin so was glad to get them. The dogs hadn't been very co-operative with the hatst all so I guess I should have expected them to look disinterested and pestered. I haven't had a cookie since I got here. Didn't bring any cookie sheets or cake pans 'cause I figured with the heat I wouldn't want to do more cooking than necessary. Reading about cookies is better than eating 'em. We gained weight since I quit retressing. Seems like just yesterday Chuck forced us to. I'm sure to mom it seems like only a decade ago that he joined. There is TV here but to get English you have to get cables. It's only \$17. a month but add to that the price of a TV and the total is out of my range. It doesn't bother me not having one anyway so it's ok.

Ponce is on the other side of the island.

We passed through it on our trip around the island. The dotted line shows our trip kind of. It took 5 hours. It wouldn't have taken

that long but the roads were narrow and mountainous for about 1/4 of the journey. That shows how small the island is. How long will you have to wait before you can get towing service again? It's funny that people that need use it the most get it withdrawn because of their need. Your trip sounds super. Surprised me that it was hot there - I always figured it to be cold. I wouldn't like staying at a European hotel. I like my bathroom close & clean!

That pension is a good idea. I ought to do that here - I certainly have enough room. I'm glad you had a good time. I thought your roses would get there before you left. One of your letters said you were leaving Sunday. Another said Tuesday so I booked in Tuesday. I

was wrong though. No, the man didn't do the yard work but the landlord gave me a mower & will deduct any garden necessities from the rent. It's almost all picked up now & really quite nice. It was bedley overgrown and difficult to do the first time but maintenance will be a breeze. The yard isn't level at all and the wheels get stuck all the time plus behind the back yard is a rubber tree and the roots are stretched all over that yard & makes it difficult. But the yards aren't as big as yours so that's a consolation. Each yard is about 1/2 the size of yours. Plenty shady for James & enough sun



Sun for me! I'm used to all the lizards now and have discovered that there's also a lot of frogs. In one day I saw both the smallest and the largest frog that we ever seen. One was about 1/2" long and the other was the size of this paper folded in half. The small one was so cute I held him and looked at him real close. The big one looked mean & nasty and he probably had teeth as big as James' so I just stood away & looked at him. I'm kind of working for AMC at home. It works out really well 'cause I don't want to work in a plant again but I probably will once they bring my programs down and they'll pay me decently. This job works out perfect 'cause I can sit in the sun & work. I'm disassembling old parts to see if they fit into any current specifications. I'm making enough to feed me and it's a good way to make money while getting tan. The car hasn't been vandalized. There is moisture in the gas tank from the trip over and it's been acting very strangely so I'll get it siphoned when I get near empty. Had to replace the gas & oil filters 'cause they were filthy. It's been back firing and drives jerky in 3rd gear. At first I thought it didn't want the other cars to think it was a foreigner so it acted as old & decrepit as the other cars around it. As it turns out it wasn't states conscious it just doesn't like to drink water. The car made it in fine shape other than that - not a scratch on it. I should have sent my gleddin' household goods in the cargo!! Almost paid smoking. Next time I'll do better. Maily doesn't work nearly as much as he did in dollars. He works maybe 50 a week. In Geta he rarely worked less than 70. They already are trying to get him to stay longer than a year. After 9 months they're gonna give him a 20% increase. That's total 150% for moving here. Not bad for a 24 (almost 25) year old kid!! I'm not actually brown yet. May is the rainy month and it certainly deserves that title. Once Juno rolls around I will be black. I haven't heard of "Talle Beach". In fact I haven't heard of any English-named beaches. The best shell hunting beaches are Liguillo and Laiza. The closest and homiest beach is Isla Verde. These are the ones I go to. They're all clean sand & nice water beaches. Plus there's enough people to feel safe and not so many that you feel cramped. These beaches aren't as nice as Hawaii.

The water is as warm but not as clear and there's more
help. There's not much coral but these 3 beaches have
gotta really rough sandstone reefs & general obstacles.
This stone hurts even my tough old feet. I would never
trust my life on a raft here. In fact, I don't go in the
water much deeper than my waist 'cause I think I
feel an under tow and I don't care to be dragged out
to sea. It's not a strong current and there isn't the
gigantic waves like Hiloai but I prefer to be safe
than drowned. I can't imagine anything on this island
being "neat and clean". Everywhere you can set your
eyes you can see litter. People have no pride in their
landscape & countryside. It's sad 'cause any tropical
place could be gorgeous with the lush growth but if
you have to look past trash & decayed bodies of cars
it loses a lot of its beauty. I will never adjust
to the plight of these streets. I have never seen
such an awful mass of dying animals. The tropics
are not kind to strays. Monge, xanthura, disease,
and malnutrition afflicts many many of the animals
here and I will never get used to it. It hurts me a lot
to see walking skeletons. I want to take them all home
with me and get 'em all fixed up but where would they
go after that - back on the streets? And where would I
put 200 dogs? I really want to try to do something
but it seems so futile. I would like to drum up
funds so at least the worst could be put to sleep and
the others could be neutered so they don't keep making
more of the same. Nope, could live here 10 years and
not adjust to the plight of these animals. And I gotta
do something, feeling sorry isn't good enough. My
animals are doing swell. James loves to sit on the
front porch (it's all grilled in) and watch the world
go by. It's shady & windy all day. Tot & Spooky
like to watch the lizards on the outside of the screen. Tot's
new hobby is to climb up the screens to get
the lizards at the top. I don't wish to deprive her
of fun but to replace screens here would cost at least
\$60, probably more so I whack her when I catch
her doing it. All the screens have tell tale signs
of her new pastime. I brush & comb the pets everyday
'cause they're shedding like crazy. I figure in 2 weeks
they'll be bald and I won't have to worry. James likes
Oregon better but Tot & Spooky like Lizardland best.
Johanie & Marlene have been in S.B. a lot lately
& I'm glad the van is fixed. When you're that mobile
it helps to have wheels. He's 26 now huh? It's good
he's working! It will help in their move to North Bay.
That has to be better than L.A. Glad to hear
Sudie & dad made it through mons absence.)

That pretty much brings you up to date. A water main broke and all of Caguas was without water all day. Now the water is so murky it's only good for flushing the toilet & showers. It's not good for drinking or brushing teeth. It has dirt in it. A small glass of it looks dark brown and after it sits it's $\frac{1}{4}$ mud and $\frac{3}{4}$ agua. I'm glad it's on now as they thought it wouldn't be fixed til sometime tomorrow. After sweating all day it is necessary to shower. And they say mud baths are healthy! My Spanish is progressing slowly. I don't learn English easily. All my neighbors are so nice and help as much as they can. This is a good neighborhood. It is noisy but, along with litter, is the problem of noise pollution. Horns are used a lot here and people spend lotsa money to get a "nice" horn. One horn plays about 6 or 7 different notes. Most horns can manage only 3 notes. Blowing your horn is not considered rude here 'cause you too for everything not just to tell someone to hurry up or watch out. I'm getting used to the driving though I still think it's insane. I had a little teensy weensy accident. It was in the rented car and I didn't know how its brakes responded on wet pavement. My estimate was off a smidgeon and I kinda nudged someone who was stopped at a red light. There were 3 high school boys and the driver got out to survey the damage. Neither car had any little thing wrong so he okayed me to go. I had frozen in the drivers seat, there was no color in my face, and my jaw was open so far my chin was in my lap. When he saw my expression he laughed and said "It's okay. Really!! It's okay!!" We had to drive side by side for awhile 'cause of the heavy traffic and he honked when he pulled off towards the airport. All but one person that we dealt with has been super nice. I was so glad they hadn't yelled at me. In spite of all of P.R.'s faults it has an awful lot of nice people. I suppose that's all the new news. Dad, for your birthday I'd like to get some plants for you. Is that okay or are you all planted out? They do ship plants to the States from here. I don't know what kinds you have or would want so if you aren't all planted out send a list of what you would want. I'm sure any plant in Hawaii would be here else. Would one of you call Dr. Wright and find out if I can get my retainer removed and if so is there a good orthodontist in San Juan? I'm afraid if I don't get this off soon my teeth will rot. Thank you for that & all the nice letters. Love to ya all from all of us

Hi!

If you look real close you can see cat foot prints on this letter. No one can say that I don't use fancy stationery & maybe I'll cover 'em all up with ink. Got your many letters today! I love to get letters! I'm glad that you researched the plant stuff. The guy at the "Flousteria" said as long as the plants were in peat that all was A OK. But the next time a person goes back to the States I'll send some with him. That oughta be OK. A man named Mike is going back to S. B. towards the end of June so he can be the carrier. I'm sure he'll be happy to do it. Plants are so cheap it's a shame not to take advantage. Bromiliads (very nice ones) are 3 bucks, pineapple plants with tiny pineapples are 4 bucks, and I got a great big plant for me and I don't know what it is 'cause I forgot to ask but it was only 20 bucks. And I got two other just green ones that I forgot to ask what they are but they look like upside down feather dusters and they were \$1.50! I bought 5 plants while looking for plants for you DAD. You're a very bad influence even though you're 4,000 miles away. My bromiliad has an orange center and my pineapple is about 7 or 8" from the bottom of the fruit to the top of the top. Can be an ~~odd~~ interesting hobby huh? And I didn't even part. really like plants. I'll check with the Agriculture Dept at the airport to make sure Mike can bring 'em to ya! Mom you mailed Freddies letter with Dad's letter. You are breaking up! Stelter is an unusual circumstance. The plant manager there pays his own rent etc. The only thing he gets is a company car. The difference is when you signed up to do what where. Stelter signed up before the company started sinking it's money belt so as long as he stays in Korea they will have to meet the terms of the contracts that they drew up. At the same time when Dick went to Korea they sent a man named George Stockton to Portugal. George also was living like a King but as soon as he got fed up with Portugal and wanted to transfer back to Soleta they said "Nope" and canned him. I'm willing to bet that the same holds true for Dick - as long as he's willing to stay in Korea filling a figurehead (only) position he can stay on but once he gets tired of it he won't have a job with AMIC. Dick is very much solely a figurehead. There are four U.S. transplants working at AMIC unlike who QC manager, Rick plant manager, Mandy Production Supervisor, and me resident dummy. job but -good Heavens - what's ol' Hobby gonna
do with his time now? He never could find some-
thing to do before. Capt. say I particularly like or
respect that man. 21 hours of slides!!! That
is a little much. I don't know how anyone could
find that many things to take pictures of. That's
nice that Jenny's coming. Nice company for Thanny!
How old is Jen now? The spray would help
Ludwig and the Blue Raid would help your house
and his chair. That's nice you're getting outside
dad! You must be brown now huh? That's a
good idea to have someone send stuff with Ame
shipments. Al Hopkins would do it I'm sure. In
free ports cigarettes are 2.50/carton. Do you want
me to pick up a bunch and send em to you
sometime? I'm golds? For that cheap I'm sure
shipping couldn't ~~make~~ make the total cost more than 3.00.
Have I told ya how the trash pickup can be anywhere
from 2 to 12 days between pick ups? I had a 12
day spread and it was a real killer. You have
to leave your bags out or ya may get stuck with
it and the dogs were raiding it every night so
I thought id get foxy and leave food out b/c
the bags so they'd get full before they had to
rip the bags. It worked swell for a couple nights
but word got out and one night when the
second batch of dogs came by there was no food
left so they ripped my bag anyway. I got
tired of gathering my trash every morning. They
got a little behind schedule last week and ended
up coming by 5 o'clock Saturday morning. I
thought id die 'cause it isn't a quiet operation.
I'm not gonna leave food out anymore 'cause the
more ya leave the more they eat. What else is
new?

I have to defrost every 2 weeks. Major appliances
are so expensive that they're used until the

place has termites there! I can see why
wood is used so sparingly. Dad, I wouldn't
want to try to talk you into coming here because
it's no Hawaii but mom I'll tell you what I
told Kathy. How often will you have to travel
to come to Puerto Rico and waste only your
time and money to get here instead of wasting
your time, money to get here, money for food &
lodging + around island travel? You may
hate it but it would be cheap. We've seen
enough so I can entertain you for a week
or so. Do ya wanna come? September &
October are supposed to be very hot so ya
gotta try to make it some other month.
But whenever is fine. Again, this is no tropical
paradise but it would be "interesting". Let
me know huh? Also, please call Dr. Wright
and find out when I can get this bleedin'
retainer off before my teeth rot out of my
mouth. Keep them cards & letters rolling in!

Hi ya'll

There isn't much to say so this will probably be a scrawny letter. Decided your eyes needed a break anyway so works best all the way around! My poor plants are already knocking on death's door. Neat-o! That's good Granny had company for that time. So Jenny fat? I hope Grannys arm is okay. Sounds like everything is going swell there. Like as soon as I left everything perked up. Well, I LIKE THAT!!! I appreciated the article that you sent me on the riots in Puerto Rico over Ford's visit but you can rest assured it was a tad over-dramatized. In the first place the Socialists have had their grand pow-wow scheduled for months to be June 27th. That is spray painted all over everything. That will take care of one of the two they will be here. The closest the demonstrators can get to the motel is 3/4 of a mile and they discourage foot knowing that the object of their hostility can't hear 'em.

One person said May was the rainy month, and then said June. I tend to side with June's side cause May was quite nice comparatively speaking. AMC Gleeta is experiencing some difficulty. The program that I was on last, Winchester, was gonna be AMC's big money maker and the other programs were gonna be phased out but Infomag put a damper on that. Infomag reported to the customers some of AM's sloppy ways like how Memoex gets the best cartridges and Bay gets the others unless they're a complete waste-out. They reported all the machine errors and inadequacies. Infomag just inherited AM's vice-president who



I had tired of AMC and he told them a bunch of stuff. Consequently, AMC's orders have dropped from 500+ to 150 and is considering leaving Infomag. James is such a good boy - ya really have to dig to get all the mite residue out and he was very patient. I didn't take him to the vet 'cause they ALL use muzzles but we seen mites before and Andrew made the right diagnoses. Next time ya go to or talk to the vet - please ask him how much MITOX is. It's 300 for a little plastic bottle here and was wondering what the difference is. Potato salad - boy does that sound good. You should make sure Johnnie retains the hide-a-bed if he doesn't stay put 'cause that's a good bed and expensive to replace nowadays. Dumpy as mentioned before is doing swell. His feet are still pretty bad and he chews 'em a lot but his fur is almost all grown back and his nose isn't allers off anymore. There's a bathroom off the master bedroom where I put Dumpy when Jones and I play ball. Three nights ago I showed Dumpy the other doggie in the bathroom mirror and ever since then when I put him in there he checks the bathroom out for the other doggie first thing! He goes in with his tail between his legs and once he's certified that the coast is clear he comes out wagging! He is so sweet but not a very good house dog. With discipline he'd be a good house dog but I hate to scold him 'cause it really hurts his feelings. So he's outside mostly and happy as can be! I don't know what more I can do for his feet. Anyhow all the pets (all four of 'em) are fine or getting better. I spend a lotte time sweeping up these days. There is a gorgeous dog at work. It's kinda medium length hair and white with rust colored

patches. His only noticeable ailment is that he has been hit by a car and limps slightly on his rear right leg. He's gorgeous and so good natured. We gotta find a home for that dog folks. Every time I go to the vets I practice what I want and what it's for in español because the receptionist doesn't speak english and I'd rather not talk to the doctor about my other pets 'cause he may not approve of me diagnosing the illnesses. And 'cause when I took Dumpy in for his check up I passed out 'cause they were preparing a dog for an operation in front of me. It was in the next room but there was a big window in the wall and I saw 'em tie the puppy to the table (in a way they don't do in the States 'cause too many dogs jumped or fell off the table and hung themselves), give him the shot, saw the dog's tongue fall out like they do, saw them take blood out of the dog's gum, and then I passed out. It must happen often 'cause they had smelly stuff ready. The vet was very nice but I felt ridiculous anyway. Besides, I need to practice Spanish. I've progressed from a vocabulary of a 4 year old to a 6 year old. Neighborhood kids help me. They like me and bring flowers for me too! They don't speak English so in this way I'm learning pretty quickly but I still don't understand most of what they say. It is discouraging but it sure puts a fire under your tail to learn fast! Yours is the only home I'm getting letters from. Two others write periodically but not often enough to fill my box. I really like getting your letters - I don't feel completely disconnected from everything. That Kathy's a real turkey. The last letter I got from her was addressed to Oregon, 'cause I wasn't real good at writing to her when she was out of the hub of things so I probably deserve it. Anyhow, keep those cards & letters rolling in!

He was a good friend and as Kathy said he wouldn't want us to hurt too much so I'm trying. It helps a lot when the loss is shared by many people. There's a thinner layer of pain when it's smeared over a wider area. Thanks again for your nice letter - it helped more than you know. The camera will take 6 weeks to get here if it wasn't sent special delivery. Marty's sister from San Fran sent a belt to him for his birthday. She sent it 3 weeks early 'cause they were moving and she wanted to be sure it didn't get lost in the shuffle. It arrived 3 weeks after his birthday. She was surprised too! Marty's usually prompt in his thank yous so she was worried that she hadn't heard from him. But at least the camera is on the way! I didn't relish the idea of buying another. I don't "feel strongly" that Bennett's hearing kept James for 3 days. Killed him, I knew it. And he had the audacity to tell Marty 2 or 3 times a day that James was getting better. Will be good to get back to reliable utilities. Electricity has been on & off for the past week or so - mostly on of course but off often enough to be a nuisance. Company gave away turkeys and Marty was here for Thanksgiving. Cats had some turkey and turned out to be too rich for 'em so I spent the following 24 hours cleaning up throw up. That'll learn me! Guess that's 'bout all. Hope your weather is better than here!

December 12 ①

Hi Y'all!

Whatcha mean you wouldn't let me come home if ya knew I
wouldn't write?! I have been negligent in my letters. Shame!
Now that I'm thoroughly scolded I'll get on to the letter.
Actually, I haven't been writing 'cause most things that
have happened sound pretty bad. I mean, it sounds like
I'm complaining & miserable but that isn't the case - it's
just a run of mal suerte (bad luck). If you keep
that in mind I'll write this letter otherwise throw it
away now 'cause I'm not suffering and don't want
ya to get that impression. The weather has been
bad for 2 or 3 weeks. Lotta clouds, wind & rain.
Perfect conditions to make mosquitos prosper and
multiply. I'm sort of under a state of siege at night
'cause if I step out they can drain me dry in a few
minutes. I don't go out much at night anyways so
that is really no problem. The 6th & 7th were perfect
days so I was gonna do yardwork. I was
scookin' poop and saw a bee flopping around a pile.
First thought was "He's dying anyway I should
pick him up in the newspaper and squash him"
but the bug lover said "He isn't dying, he's just
shaking the chill out of his wings 'cause it dipped
to 75° last night." The bug lover was so 15 minutes
later when I was mowing in that area the little
vermint stabbed me in the arch of my foot when

I stepped on him. I removed the stinger and went in the house and waited to kick the bucket. Since my stories have had sad endings lately I figured I have inherited dad's allugy. Half an hour later I was conscious and my foot looked like a foot so I went out and finished the yards. It was only painful when the stinger went in - otherwise it was just a nuisance. Then I caught a cold - here in the tropics?!! Then Flaky went into heat - just after she had been introduced to "the boys" and got to likin' having company to sply with. Now none of the dogs are happy but im not gonna put em together at the present time - 6 puppies is not what I need. Mike Ruddys girl friend, Liesel, moved down. She's been here 2 days and already has a puppy from the streets. Well, she doesn't have him - I do. Liesel is from Sweden and is a very meticulous house keeper. I mean, she lets her animals on the sofa and stuff but "diseased" animals give her the willies. Little "Rusty" has mange & worms so im gonna doctor him for 2 or 3 weeks and when his wonderful shell take him. If he looked a little less dirty and flea ridden when she met him she probably wouldn't have minded. Rusty had a flea bath and powder session first thing. His mange isn't bad - his ears and elbows are bad but other than that it's just small patches of mange.

He can't believe this paradise - a pillow to lay on, food
and fresh water. He's a little shy - he kinda piddles
when ya pick him up but already he likes people
and doesn't piddle as frequently. He's about 8 weeks old,
rust colored, and weighs about 11 lbs. He's so cute and
I'm so glad Liesel thought so too. I had seen him
yesterday at the plant and when Mike brought Liesel
by today I casually mentioned this cute little pup.
She wanted to go see him and 5 minutes later he was
hers! She will be good to him - she loves dogs. Mike
says her favorite thing is to window shop at the Humane
Society - it's just she can't touch a mangy dog. I
suppose lotsa folks are that way - it's like Hillside House
you can do it or ya can't. I'm so excited 'cause he is
a gorgeous & sweet puppy. He'll be a small dog like
about 30 lbs. I'm gonna take pictures of him tomorrow,
have 3 pretty spiders on the clothes line. Remember the
picture of the spider I took in Hawaii? Two of these
look like him. They look like crabs with a bright
yellow body and red spikes. I took color pictures -
I hope they turn out. The other spider isn't as
colorful but he has a neat body shape. I'm an
incurrigible spider freak. I hope those pictures turn
out okay. I've been working more at AMC 'cause of the
holiday comin' up. "Lady" is in heat and there are
lotsa dog fights. Remember "Lady" - she's the one in the
picture where I was crouched down with my new short
hair. Lady is Coffie's mom.

I think I told ya they hauled all the dogs at the plant away. I lied. I thought they had 'cause only lady of the old gang was there for about a week. Slowly the other dogs have been reappearing and the whole gang is back. It isn't the same though 'cause Lady's heat attracted a big red male and he's so mean. All the old gang has wounds from him. I was pettin' lady and he growled and snarled at me! He's afraid of people so he was bluffing but he is mean. Marty wants to kill him. Hell never do it but he'd like to. Used to be only lady, George, Smiley, Mangual and Sneaky by the plant and they are good friendly dogs. Mangual was run over in the parking lot and died - he was my favorite sato. So we only had 4 dogs with occasional strays that were also nice. Then ~~the~~ Big Red comes with 4 or 5 of his male followers. Big Red is the only mean one in the bunch, the others are shy, but he's completely changed the nice pattern of the old times. I can't explain the change but it's there. All my dogs are cowed. I don't wanna leave food 'cause B.R. would get it and don't wanna encourage him to stay. Maybe he'll disappear when lady is no longer in heat. I hope so! Dogs Dogs Dogs. I can't help it - I really like dogs though lotta times I wish I hated 'em so I wouldn't feel bad they were homeless, diseased & mutilated by cars or fights.

The camera came one month and 6 days after it was mailed. Swift service huh? I passed my guilt feelings about Alga. I can't feel guilty - she was in the hands of professionals and if that's the best they could do they shouldn't be allowed to practice! They wouldn't have listened to me anyway and would have answered questions to suit their "assumptions". I just feel bad still 'cause I knew all along they were doin' something wrong. They are so dry and expensive that I'm gonna by pass a tree this year. There are no cranberries here anyway so would look pretty ugly! A tree for \$3 or \$4, there is \$10. or \$11. here. There are some Christmas lights up now. It surprised me to see any, really, on houses or outside trees 'cause of the expense but there are quite a few. It doesn't feel like Christmas. When the absolute coldest it

gets is 75° it's hard to imagine Santa & the North Pole etc. Matij's gonna be in SB sometime after the 1st of the year so he's bringin' your presents. ☺ DON'T trust the mail especially this time of the year. Please excuse the delay but was the best idea I could come up with. Mom, did ya get hold of Ken Dworken's folks? He used to work at AMC. Know it's awkward to say "I'm trying to get in touch with your son..." pero es muy importante. Granny this letter was for you too. Hope all's well and you're fine fine fine. I have received so many compliments on my ring. Thank you again! Dad, ya better have stopped your coughing by now. My pets are swell, Matij's swell, I'm swell and everything is wonderful! Santa Barbara made it in the San Juan Star 'cause of your rain. Ojai got special mention 'cause they were the wettest. We haven't had much rain - afternoon clouds but no water. Past two days have been 90° but that doesn't help a tan when it's cloudy. Tans come and tans go so not much sense to sweat the load. Everyone is fine. Holly spent 2 days in the hospital gettin' purged of heartworms. Heartworms are a pain - there should be some mosquito control goin' on. Dumpy had a tooth pulled and ears flushed. Everyone has ear mites so twice a week I gotta doctor their ears. The medicine is oil base so it looks like a "Wet head is dead" commercial. They don't like havin' stuff put in their ears so it's a struggle and I hate Mondays & Fridays. Oscar doesn't have mange but he still needs some fur to cover his bald spots. He's such a quiet puppy. He doesn't like being held or cuddled. Coffee, Tot & Spook are fine. Has Ken dropped the pictures by yet? He hasn't written so I thought maybe he lost them or somethin'. Seems like James has been dead forever and it's only been 2 months. What a friend he was. So sorry to hear Ludwig's back was bad those days. Have you kept him slender? He needs all the help he can + :

get from his people. You should see this pen-Dumpy & Coffey has chewed it and it looks more like a paint brush than a pen. Dogs Dogs Dogs! The Romi-Parmesan was tasty too. Haven't seen that here either. The calendar arrived and filled in the blank '96 space. It was fun & interesting seein' all those new-fangled foods & items - thank you!

Marty enjoyed his ham & is enjoying his strings. Did you see the book John & Mae gave to me? Hope you did 'cause it was be-you-tiful! I love it. They gave Marty a folding umbrella that he's used about 14 times in the past 7 days. Ugly weather great umbrella! It was kinda fun waiting so late. Change of subject. I ran into my first overt anti-American people today. The statehood issue has rubbed some few the wrong way. I was in Old San Juan with two blonde very Anglo looking ladies. Three boys (about 16 years old) passed saying in Spanish for American tourists to go home and stay home and don't change PR and stuff. I wanted to smack 'em in the mouth!

They are too young to ~~decide~~ have their own opinion and to emulate older folks is not always the best thing to do. Without tourists, particularly American tourists, 'cause they ARE numerous, this island would be so poor they couldn't afford food stamps!!! There have been numerous ANTI-STATEHOOD rallies and stuff. In the immortal words of Kathy "Who wants PR???" She wasn't what you could call horribly impressed with the island. It was the ol' "It's a nice place to visit but . . ."
